Requirements to be an ACTIVE member: FTA members must participate in the following activities: observe a teacher at the Elem/MS in the fall & spring, provide treats for the HS teachers/write "thank you" notes (when assigned), and/or serve as a tutor/teacher/office aide.

NATIONAL HONOR SOCIETY -----

Advisor:

Purpose/Mission of Club: The purpose of the Anthony Wayne Chapter of the National Honor Society is to promote scholarship, leadership, character, and service qualities among the students of FRHS.

Requirements to be an ACTIVE member: The student must be a junior or senior with a 3.5 GPA (starting with the class of 2020), and the student must be selected to be inducted into the NHS.

Dues: Help with fundraiser and/or dues, dependent upon need

How to Join: Juniors and seniors with the required GPA are asked to complete a Candidate Form, typically due in September. All teachers rate each eligible student in the categories of Leadership, Character, and Service. The NHS advisor, who is a non-voting member, tabulates the data and shares the results with the faculty council, a team of five faculty members from different departments, or subject areas. The faculty council uses the data, along with the information supplied by the candidates, to select new inductees. The students selected are inducted at a ceremony typically held in November.

Purpose/Mission of Club: To provide students with the best preventive tools possible to deal with the issues of underage drinking, other drug use, risky behaviors, impaired driving, and other destructive decisions.
