## District Notifications

### **Directory Information Policy of Fort Recovery Local Schools**

It is the policy of Fort Recovery Local Schools to release the directory information listed below unless a parent or an adult student requests us to withhold some or all of the directory information. Please notify the appropriate school building by October 15, 2024 if you wish to have any of this information withheld. If parents or adult students make no response to withhold the information, it will be released if requested. The board designates as student "Directory Information" : a student's name; address; telephone number; date and place of birth; major field of study; participation in officially recognized activities and sports; weight and height, if a member of athletic teams; dates of attendance; date of graduation; or awards received.

### **Notice of Emergency Notification**

This is a required announcement for the 2024-25 school year that Fort Recovery schools will once again utilize the One Call Now system for notifying parents in the event of delays and closings, emergencies or a serious threat to safety. This will be used in lockdown situations and natural disasters. All alerts will be through One Call Now and managed by you through the portal. You can set up notifications by following these steps:

- Click on the One Call Now link, select "Sign Up" and follow step by step instructions

Once your account is set up, notification preferences will be maintained by you. You can add, delete and change your information on your own by logging in through our website.

### **Advisory of Pesticide Application in Classroom Buildings**

The district is providing you with the option to be informed prior to any application of a pesticide in a classroom building during this school year. In certain emergencies, pesticides may be applied without prior notice to control organisms that pose an immediate health threat, but you will be notified following any such application. If you would like to receive prior notification, please call 419-375-4139.

### **Attendance Reminder for All**

If a student is absent thirty-eight (38) or more hours in one (1) school month, or sixty-five (65) or more hours in a school year, that student is considered "excessively absent" from school. **Any time not in school will be documented and counted towards the student's attendance record. Tardies and/or early leave from school will be tracked and will be counted towards the attendance record.** Absences with a written medical excuse will not count towards a student's attendance record. It is strongly encouraged to obtain a medical note from your health care provider when appointments and medical needs take place during the school day.





# FROM THE PRINCIPAL'S DESK

Hello! Who would believe it? August is already here, summer break is nearly in the rear view mirror, Fall sports are well underway, and we are ready to welcome students back into the building on August 21st for the first day of school. I hope all have been able to enjoy the beautiful summer we have been blessed with. While the staff here at FRLS has had the opportunity to relax and reset for the new school year, that does not mean the school has not been buzzing with activity. The summer cleaning, technology, and maintenance crews have done a spectacular job of preparing the building for another school year; many projects have been completed to enhance the beautification and practicality of our facilities; and students have been active on the premises with FFA, Band Camp, and sports practices.

The high school staff will see just a few changes for this upcoming school year. Mrs. Taylor (Thien) Franck has been hired to fill the big shoes left by Mr. Joe Bruns in the high school math department. The kitchen crew will see a complete turnover with the retirements of Mrs. Norma Pottkotter and Mrs. Karen Schwieterman. Mrs. Kate Timmerman takes over as the lead cook, with Mrs. Susan Pugh coming from the EMS building and Mrs. Tanya Storie as a new hire filling the roles of cooks as well. We will also see Mrs. Chelsea Kahlig back in the high school building for part of the day as she will be splitting time between both buildings this school year. We welcome all of these amazing people to their new roles here at FRHS!

The 2024-25 school year will also see some exciting changes in our programming here at FRHS. Sports Officiating is now an official class option for all students, providing students with an opportunity to earn their officiating license in six different sports. Also, a new math class, titled "Mathematical Modeling and Reasoning", has been added as an alternative to Algebra 2. This course is designed to promote reasoning, problem-solving and modeling through real-world and relevant units focused on mathematical practices, including topics such as vacation planning, driving for gas, and loan calculations. Additionally, there will be more opportunities for students to earn relevant licenses throughout different classes that can be utilized post-graduation, including the possibility of drone flying! All students at the high school will have access to PLT4M, a K-12 wellness platform that will provide students with tools to improve their physical and mental well-being. Finally, the implementation of an incentive program based around student engagement will hopefully help us see an increase in the amount of activities students participate in throughout the school year. These encompass just a few of the many relevant programs we offer here at Fort Recovery.

Looking ahead, schedule pick-up for the students in grades 10-12 will begin on August 14th, with the high school office open from 8:00 a.m.-3:00 p.m. each weekday. Freshman Orientation will take place from 10:00-11:30 a.m. on Monday, August 19th. Open building for the high school will also be held on August 19th from 3:30-7:00 p.m. Students will begin school on Aug. 21st.

Early decision plans are binding — a student who is accepted as an ED applicant must withdraw all other college applications.

Early action plans are nonbinding — students receive an early response to their application but do not have to commit to the college until the normal reply date of May 1.

## Transportation

There will be a transportation information table set up at Open Building Night on Monday, August 19th at the EMS building.

1. New this year: Full routes will not be posted on our website. Instead, beginning on Wednesday, August 14, after board approval, your child's bus number and pick-up/drop off times will be located on their transportation tab in FinalForms.
  - a. Log in to your child's page
  - b. Click on "Forms"
  - c. Click on "Transportation"
  - d. Information on Bus# and times will be at the top of the page
2. Please be sure to sign up for the Remind app for your child's bus. Information will be available at the open building.
3. If at any time in the school year there is a **PERMANENT** bus route change please update your final forms. This will notify us of the change and we will contact you when the change has been made. Any questions feel free to reach out to Stacy Laux at [lauxs@fortrecoveryschools.org](mailto:lauxs@fortrecoveryschools.org).
4. We will not be issuing bus passes for the 2024-25 school year. Students will not be permitted to ride any bus other than their own. If your child is having a friend over you will need to arrange Alternative Transportation. Please limit daily transportation changes unless it is an emergency. This creates confusion for the child/children, teachers, secretaries and bus drivers.
5. In-Town Stop locations will remain at Brockman-Boeckman Funeral Home and at the Fort Recovery Visitor's Center.
6. If your child walks to the bus stop or to school, please practice with your child before school starts.
