To that end, we have simplified and adjusted our booking procedures in the district. You can now request to book district facilities online at fortrecoveryschools.org using a simple form. Happy New Year! I hope all had a wonderful and blessed holiday season. We are excited to get the second semester underway here in the high school. A lot of great events are going on this time of year, including basketball games, swim meets, bowling matches, and band/choir concerts. We love seeing the community attend these events and the students certainly appreciate the support.

In December, the Ohio Department of Higher Education released details on the new Ohio Governor's Merit Scholarship. This scholarship, beginning with this year's seniors, will be offered to the top 5% of Senior students annually in each school in the state of Ohio. The scholarship will be worth up to \$20,000 (up to \$5,000 a year renewable for four years) for each student. To accept the scholarship, the student must be attending a college within the state of Ohio. The intent is to help motivate the top students in the state to remain in the state for their higher education.

The introduction of this scholarship has brought to the forefront the discussion of how class rank is determined in school districts. Here at Fort Recovery, class rank is based on a percentage formula including a student's GPA, number of honors classes taken in high school, ACT score, and number of credits earned. While some schools base class rank on GPA only, often causing many ties at the top with multiple 4.0s, our formula helps break those ties and rewards those students taking more rigorous classes in high school. It has been very effective for us since its first use in 2018 and is being modeled now by other schools as they look to determine their top 5% of students for this scholarship.

This year the submission deadline for the scholarship was Dec. 20th, so the current class rank was used to determine the top 5% (4 total) eligible students here at Fort Recovery. In future years, the submission deadline will be Sept. 1st. Therefore, for the class of 2025 and beyond, the senior class rank at the end of August will be used to determine the top 5% of students who will be offered the scholarship. The intention then is to pass the offer off to those students prior to them determining which college they plan to attend. This is a major scholarship opportunity for students here in the state, and I am glad that the ODHE was able to make this available for this year's seniors.



Happy New Year from the staff and students at Fort Recovery Elementary School! We are halfway through our school year. Student grade cards for the second nine weeks have been published to Progressbook, so please make sure to check your child's progress with grades. If you need assistance with accessing your child's grades, please call the elementary office and we will be happy to help.

Kindergarten registration for the 2024-2025 school year is fast approaching! To be eligible for Fort Recovery kindergarten for next school year, children must turn 5 years old on or before August 1, 2024. We will be working with Fort Recovery Public Preschool, Mercer County ESC Preschool, and Mercer County Head Start to gather information about students who will be ready for kindergarten in the fall. If your child attends one of these preschools, they will share your child's kindergarten readiness information with you and with Fort Recovery Elementary School. If your child does not attend one of these preschools, please contact the Fort Recovery Elementary office to schedule a conference to visit the school and determine your child's readiness skills.

At this time, our first step in preparing for next year's kindergarten class is to compile a list of potential kindergarten students. Please complete the form sent home with your child and return to your child's preschool or the Fort Recovery Elementary office no later than February 7, 2024, or scan the QR code and complete the form online. Additional information and forms will be sent home or mailed to students planning to enroll in kindergarten at the beginning of March. Transitioning to kindergarten is a big step, so please reach out to us if you have any questions or concerns. We hope to help ease the transition for parents and children as much as possible.
