

What is involved with a school safety reunification?

One of the most critical aspects of a school emergency response is a responsible reunification of our students with a parent or guardian in the event of a school crisis or emergency. Our school district has initiated steps to improve our school safety readiness in this area.

During the last teacher professional development day on November 28, the Fort Recovery Local School District conducted a pre-planned evacuation and reunification drill. Teachers and law enforcement officials were participants in this functional exercise. The scope of the exercise was limited to the evacuation and reunification of approximately 20 children of FRLS staff members. The drill started with an evacuation of the building due to a simulated gas leak south of the Elementary/ Middle School Building. The participating students and the majority of the staff were transported to the high school via school bus. Upon their arrival, the staff set up a Family Information Center and Reunification Location (FICAR). The parents of the participating students were then alerted about the simulated evacuation with directions on where to pick up their children. The drill was helpful as we attempt to continuously improve our readiness for a variety of safety situations and preparedness measures.

### Tips for Parents and Guardians to prepare for a real reunification situation:

- 1. Be prepared to have a photo ID ready when picking up your children. There are multiple safety measures involved in a reunification and the staff members will be verifying your identity.
- 2. Have a backup for receiving notification of reunification details. The district has multiple indoor and outdoor reunification sites based on the emergency and reunification information will

be disseminated through local media, social media platforms, One Call Now and other direct communication methods. Site-specific considerations will impact how these practices can be integrated into school safety plans.

3. Understand that this reunification process is not simple and therefore, all parents and guardians need to be aware that accuracy and accountability are much more important than the speed of the reunification.

The district appreciates the specialized guidance and the cooperative work of the Fort Recovery Police Department as we continue to train, practice and exercise our safety protocols.

### 2023 - 2024 Kindergarten

Fort Recovery is working to prepare for the class of 2035! If you have a child who will turn 5 by August 1, 2023, you may be considering Kindergarten and how to register. Fort Recovery Elementary School will work with the Fort Recovery Preschool, Mercer County ESC Preschool, and Mercer County Head Start to determine children who are eligible and will then send home registration information. Students who are age-eligible for Kindergarten should have received a letter of intent from his/her preschool. If you did not receive one, please ask your child's preschool teacher or call the Fort Recovery Elementary office. If you have a child who plans to attend Kindergarten for the 2023-2024 school year who does not attend any of the preschools mentioned above, please call the Elementary office (419-375-2768) for registration information. For children not attending a preschool, we ask that you schedule an appointment for Kindergarten screening. We will hold Kindergarten screening on Friday, March 3.

### 2023 - 2024 Fort Recovery Preschool

Fort Recovery Preschool is looking ahead to the 2023-24 school year. Preschool for next year will be 4 days (Monday - Thursday) with a morning or afternoon option. Preference for preschool will be given to children who are age eligible for Kindergarten for the 2024-2025 school year (must be 5 on or before August 1, 2024). Registration for preschool will be online. There will not be an in person meeting for registration. The online registration will open on Monday, March 13 at 8:00am. The registration link will be on the Fort Recovery Preschool's website. A hyperlink will also be on the Elementary's Facebook page and webpage. The online registration will remain open until all available slots are filled, this will likely happen quickly so please do not wait to register! We strongly encourage parents to work on carpool arrangements prior to the registration to know if you need/prefer the morning or afternoon session.

- Purchased Pass Blast Passes will be available for pickup starting on August 8, 2023
- Regular Season Pass Prices Effective August 8, 2023
- If you are purchasing an adult All-Sport or a boy basketball ticket, we will keep you in the same reserved seat unless you indicate otherwise. If you would like to pick new seats you will be able to do this when you pick up your tickets beginning August 8th.

### This Pass Blast is a great opportunity for your family to save some money! Check it out!

#### Example:

65 year old Fort Recovery School District resident. Wants to get a senior citizen pass AND wants a reserved seat for boys basketball.

- → Pass Blast Price: Senior Citizens pass \$25 + Boys Basketball Ticket \$40 = \$65
- → After August 8th Senior Citizen pass \$30 + Boys Basketball Ticket \$55 = \$85

### Example

Family of 5 - Usually get (3) student all sport passes and (2) All Sport Adult.

- → Pass Blast Price: (3) student All Sport \$75 + (2) All Sport Adult \$200 = \$275
- → After August 8th (3) Students \$150 + (2) Adult \$300 = \$450.00

Normally, you buy your student a boys basketball and football season pass.

- → Pass Blast Price: BBK \$20 + FB \$10 = \$30 OR
  Buy a student all sport pass for \$25 and get
  into all home sporting events for JH and HS
  for the 2023-24 year!!!
- → After August 8th BBK \$35 + FB \$15 = \$50

### Fort Recovery High School Elects Inductees to the Athletic Hall of Fame

The Fort Recovery High School Athletic Hall of Fame will have two new members in its 2023 induction class. The induction ceremony will be held between the JV and Varsity Boys' Basketball games scheduled for Saturday, January 28, 2023. The two new inductees will join the 45 other individual inductees who have been selected since the Hall of Fame was established in 2007. One team has also been inducted. The 2023 inductees are Jennia (Jenkins) Knestrick and Joanna (Snyder) Hiatt.



Jennia (Jenkins) Knestrick is a 1990 graduate of Fort Recovery High School. She earned three varsity letters in volleyball and softball. During her freshman year in softball, she was chosen as Most Improved and during her senior year she was chosen as Most Valuable Player.

She also led the team in batting average during that senior season. Jennia excelled as a basketball player at FRHS. She was a 4 year letter winner. She ranks 19th in career scoring. As a senior, she was co-captain and helped lead the Lady Indians to the 1990 State Championship. She was voted Second Team All-MAC as a senior. She was also selected as a District 8 All-Star. After graduation from FRHS, Jennia continued her athletic career at the University of Findlay in both basketball and softball.
