
The junior and senior classes will meet on March 20th for the following:

This year in the middle school we have made a concerted effort to really educate our students on the three beliefs we strive to instill in our students here at Fort Recovery, summarized as the "Indian Way." Those three beliefs include "Power of the Tribe," "Passion to Grow," and "Own It." Three separate months throughout the school year have been designated as belief months (i.e. February was Passion to Grow Month) with designated activities to that particular belief, Tribe meetings throughout the year have activities associated with the beliefs, middle school announcements have advertised the beliefs, students can earn monthly Above the Line awards based on demonstrating these qualities, and most importantly, on a daily basis, the staff strives to model the beliefs through our actions and words.

Power of the Tribe behaviors include respecting each other, listening, talking with people even when it's hard, and bringing others along. When these behaviors are achieved we work together, learn together, and achieve together. As a school we utilize our tribes as one model of this belief. With students from each grade included in each tribe, students are brought together with others that they may normally not associate with to work towards a common goal and purpose. The tribe leaders encourage conversations and teamwork amongst their tribe. With each meeting, the Power of the Tribe grows. How do you model this belief in your everyday life? Are you setting great examples of this to the students in our community?

Passion to Grow behaviors include embracing the journey, accepting challenges, and being coachable. When these behaviors are achieved we maximize our opportunities. As a school one way we model this belief is through personalized learning. Meeting the needs of each individual student empowers them to learn and grow. How do you model this belief in your everyday life? Are you empowering the students in our community around you to learn every day?

Own It behaviors include owning your attitude, owning your effort, and owning your choices. When these behaviors are achieved we can be the best version of ourselves. As a school we challenge our students to be better people and hold them accountable for their actions. But we also help them understand their responses to events and educate them on how events are not always controllable, but our reactions to them are. When students are given the opportunity to choose and be responsible for themselves, they really can become the best version of themselves. How do you model this belief in your everyday life? Are you challenging the students in our community to always make the best choices?

As our district motto states, education is a community effort. When all stakeholders come together, we provide our students with the best environment to thrive. Lucky for us, we live in one awesome community. Thank you to everyone for making Fort Recovery a remarkable place to work and learn.

<u>NEW</u> this year! Beginning April 17-28, we will have our first ever Pass Blast! All season passes for the 2023-24 school year will be drastically reduced.

- Pass Blast Prices Valid ONLY from April 17, 2023 Through and Including April 28, 2023
- No Season Pass Sales From April 29, 2023 to August 7, 2023
- Purchased Pass Blast Passes will be available for pickup starting on August 8, 2023
- Regular Season Pass Prices Effective August 8, 2023
- If you are purchasing an adult All-Sport or a boy basketball ticket, we will keep you in the same reserved seat unless you indicate otherwise. If you would like to pick new seats you will be able to do this when you pick up your tickets beginning August 8th.

This Pass Blast is a great opportunity for your family to save some money! Check it out!

Example:

65 year old Fort Recovery School District resident. Wants to get a senior citizen pass AND wants a reserved seat for boys basketball.

- → Pass Blast Price: Senior Citizens pass \$25 + Boys Basketball Ticket \$40 = \$65
- → After August 8th Senior Citizen pass \$30 + Boys Basketball Ticket \$55 = \$85

Example

Family of 5 - Usually get (3) student all sport passes and (2) All Sport Adult.

- → Pass Blast Price: (3) student All Sport \$75 + (2) All Sport Adult - \$200 = \$275
- → After August 8th (3) Students \$150 + (2) Adult \$300 = \$450.00

Example

Normally, you buy your student a boys basketball and football season pass.

- → Pass Blast Price: BBK \$20 + FB \$10 = \$30 OR Buy a student all sport pass for \$25 and get into all home sporting events for JH and HS for the 2023-24 year!!!
- → After August 8th BBK \$35 + FB \$15 = \$50
